




#### **Black History Month**

#### A February Entry in Alabama s Bloody Sunday Story

Editor's Note: When I was researching 'Important Dates' for this issue, I ran across February 18, 1965 and Jimmie Lee Jackson. His name sounded familiar but out of reach for my recall. I then read about him and realized - we need to know this story. Because the night of February 18, 1965 was the impetus for Bloody Sunday. And exactly now is when we need to know and understand about Mr. Jimmie Lee Jackson. Thanks to Baldwin County Leaguer Jeanine Normand for crafting this story on very short notice.



On February 18, 1965, Reverend C. T. Vivian led a peaceful march in Marion, Alabama to protest the prejudicial jailing of the young, civil rights activist, James Orange, who was the field secretary for the Southern Conference Leadership Conference. The participants left Zion United Methodist Church, intending to march to the Perry County Jail. At the post office, a harsh line of city, county, and state law enforcement officers awaited them. The ensuing brutal attack by state troopers resulted in many gruesome injuries among the marchers, including the tragic shooting of marcher Jimmie Lee Jackson.

After cruelly beating Jimmie Lee Jackson, an Alabama State Trooper then shot him in the stomach. Jackson had been valiantly trying to protect his mother from being beaten, too, which had enraged the state trooper. Eight days later on February 26, 1965, in a Selma hospital, Jimmie Lee Jackson died from his unwarranted gunshot wound and beating. There

were two memorial services held for the lamentable circumstances of his death. Martin Luther King, Jr. spoke at one:



"Jimmie Lee Jackson so death says to us that we must work passionately and unrelentingly to make the American dream a reality. His death must prove that unmerited suffering does not go unredeemed. We must not be bitter, and we must not harbor ideas of retaliating with violence. We must not lose faith in our white brothers."

Civil rights leaders called for a peaceful march from Selma to Montgomery. The main purpose of this march was to bring attention to three main issues: the unjustifiable death of Jimmie Lee Jackson, the ongoing police violence against citizens, and the continued quest for voting rights for all.

Governor George Wallace ominously ordered Alabama state troopers to "use whatever means necessary to stop the march." The march was held a few days later on March 7, 1965. Law enforcement responded with shocking, unbridled viciousness toward the brave and respectful marchers, who merely tried to peacefully walk over the Edmund Pettus Bridge. This event became known as Bloody Sunday.

Television coverage of the horrors of Bloody Sunday rightfully ignited national outrage. Bloody Sunday, a model for non-violent resistance, maintains pivotal significance in American history as the turning point for voting rights. Bloody Sunday changed the minds of the majority of Americans to support of civil rights for African Americans.





#### Tuscaloosa Municipal Elections

March 4, 2025

Election day for the city of Tuscaloosa is Tuesday March 4. The qualification period for the 16 races was January 14-28. 25 candidates were announced on Friday January 29. Ten of the 16 races are unopposed.

The deadline for registration, whether online or in person is Monday, February 17. Mailed registrations must be received by Monday, February 17.

A team of league members from state and Greater Tuscaloosa are working to set up Vote411 as a voter resource for this election. The project will serve as a pilot for a possible statewide larger project to implement Vote411 for 50 cities in August 2025.

A candidate forum is planned for 6:30-8:30 pm Thursday, February 18 at Grace Presbyterian Church (113 Hargrove Rd, Tuscaloosa, AL, 35401). All candidates will be invited.






